

ILESE is a complex and ambitious undertaking, bringing to you the possibility of huge rewards. Here are the key facts...

What is ILESE: The Evidence?

ILESE is a database of evidence. It provides evidence concerning how *all types* of learning spaces impact students of *all capacities*.

It allows users to compile tailor-made banks of evidence concerning the impact of all learning spaces on student *learning outcomes, participation and engagement, and inclusion and well-being*.

The data will come from student experiences in an anticipated 400 schools across approximately 12 countries.

An unprecedented network of more than 250 international leaders from industry, education and academia is driving this project.

What will it accomplish?

ILESE will allow its partners to say, 'this is the evidence'.

The database, called ARGO, will inform cost-effective high impact infrastructure initiatives, evidence-based design and schooling and curricular initiatives.

What's in it for us?

You will have quarantined access to ARGO for the 3 years of the funding.

You will be able to ask ARGO for evidence on issues that are particular to your organisation. You will be able to benchmark your situation internationally.

You will be invited to work with LEARN to design a 'spin off' project that uses ARGO data to address issue/s relevant to your circumstances.

What will we be asked to do?

Collecting data for ARGO will be organised by the Management Team, but you may wish to participate.

You will be invited to participate in network meetings and events over the three years.

You will be invited to assist in the project's design, to make requests from ARGO, and to negotiate spin-off projects.

What will it cost?

Partnership will be through an individually negotiated 3-year contract, based on the scale of your organisation and your anticipated use of ARGO.

Contributions are likely to range from AUD\$30,000 to AUD\$150,000 per year, to be negotiated.
